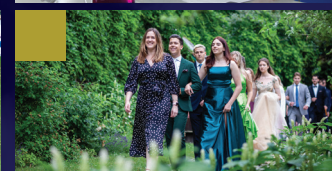
The English College prides itself on offering an education to help students develop into well-rounded individuals, capable of adapting to life after school and going on to have successful and happy lives.

The English College in Prague - Anglické gymnázium is a selective six-year English grammar school and is also part of the Czech school system. It was established in 1994 to revive the tradition of British style education in Prague established in 1927 by the Prague English Grammar School (PEGS).

HRH The Prince of Wales and President Václav Havel agreed to be patrons of the College when it was established.

The College became the first school to offer the International Baccalaureate in the Czech Republic in 1995. Every year around 70 students at the English College take the full IB Diploma exams.

Most graduates go on to study at universities, mainly in the UK, but also in the Czech Republic and elsewhere in the world.



English College in Prague alumni can be found all over the world. Many are still in the Czech Republic, but others are as far away as the UK, Australia, America, Vietnam and China. Amongst them are artists, designers, academics, musicians, doctors, solicitors, businessmen and women, scientists, charity campaigners and diplomats – many different professions, but the thing they all share is the solid foundation of an ECP education.

We run a competitive work experience scheme, where each year a number of our students spend time in a working environment in Prague or in London.
